



#### ICE PAINTING

- With your child some put some water in an ice tray and add some different paint colours and a lollipop stick or straw in each slot. Pop it into the freezer. Once it's frozen have some fun spending time painting with your ice!
- You can also freeze some water in a small tray and use your paints directly on the ice.
- Talk to your child about how it feels.What colours would you like to choose?What will you create with your ice paints?
- Extension questions: What happens when you mix the colours? What happened to the water after you put it in the freezer? Talk about what is happening to the ice over time.

#### SNOWBALL PAINTING

- Using some pegs and pom poms/ cotton balls/ any material you like, and some paint create some lovely snowball patterns on paper.
- What colours would you like to use?
- Could you mix colours?
- Could you make something other than snowballs?
- Will you use big or small pom poms?
- What do you need to do to the pegs to pick up your pom pom?
- Maybe you can add some more things to your picture?





# FAKE SNOW

- You will need: I bag of cornflour (about 450g) and I cup of conditioner.
- Mix these ingredients together in a bowl until you get a consistency that's not too sticky. If you find it's too sticky you can add more cornflour and if it's too dry add some more conditioner.
- Work together with your child to measure the ingredients and mix them together.
- What will you make with your snow?
- How does it feel?
- Maybe you could add some scented oil to make it smell different?



## **PUFFY PAINT**

- You will need: 1/2 shaving foam, 1/2 PVA glue & food colouring (optional)
- Measure out the ingredients with your child into a bowl and mix them together.
- If you want you can add some food colouring to your paint to make different colours!
- Have fun using your puffy paint!
- What will you use to spread your paint? Is it like normal paint?
- What are you going to create? Could you add more things into your creations?



# PUDDLE PAINTING

- You will need: Coloured chalks
- During rainy weather, with your child go out and find some puddles. Dipping your chalk into the water creates a paint effect and you can make lots of lovely pictures and patterns on the pavement!
- Can you mix the colours in the puddles?
- What colours are you using?
- What happens to the puddle when you use the chalks? Do they change colour?
- You could even use small pieces to of chalk to crush into the puddles.

### WINTER COLLAGE

- With your child, look for some different materials around the house or outside (paper, tissue, foil, cotton balls, leaves, sticks, etc.)
- Make a creation using your found items! You could make a loose part collage and take a picture of it or use glue or tape to stick it all together!
- Will you use scissors to cut or tear apart using your hands?
- Talk to your child about what they are doing, what they want to use.



## JUNK MODELLING

- Junk modelling is using unwanted or items that were going to go in the bin to create art.
- The projects in the pictures were made using ribbon, egg cartons, plastic cups, cereal boxes; you can use whatever you like in your junk modelling!
- Help your child look for things they might want to use and have fun together!
- Ask your child questions to support their imagination and problem solving skills; "What can we use to stick these together?" "How can we make this bigger/taller?"
