Literacy Policy

Rationale - Literacy covers, speaking, listening and reading. In the Early Years Literacy is important as it gives children these essential life skills that they will use on a daily basis as well as preparing them for school.

Our Aims and Objectives

- Use books carefully and correctly
- Make significant progress in their individual learning

Implementation - Staff will implement this policy through:

- Following the letter and sound phonic programmes
- Providing an excellent role model of being literate by providing a rich literate learning environment
